CITY OF MANTECA PARKS AND RECREATION UPDATE TAKING STEPS TO REDUCE EXPOSURE

The City of Manteca is taking a series of steps recommended by public health officials to minimize the risk of spreading COVID-19 in the community, following President Trump's declaration of a national emergency and the World Health Organizations' declaration of a global pandemic. These actions should not be considered a reason for heightened concern. The City is taking them in compliance with the recommendations of the Governors' Office and the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) to slow the spread of the virus.

These measures primarily affect recreation activities, including public private gatherings at City-operated facilities. This includes the Manteca Public Library, The Manteca Senior Center, and Preschool where persons are unable to remain at least 6 feet apart, the social distancing recommended by the CDPH.

Effective immediately and through April 6, all Parks and Recreation sponsored public events and activities are cancelled. This includes:

Closure of Manteca Public Library

All City Events

Youth and Adult Sports Activities

Indoor and outdoor events and rentals.

The Senior Center will be closed with the exception of congregate lunch program that will be offered in a to-go fashion and the senior brown bag program.

Spring Break Camp and all programs that operate on MUSD facilities.

All recreation classes and programs.

All Commission and Committee meetings, including SAC and YAC
