



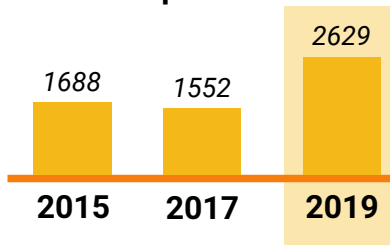
SAN JOAQUIN 2019 HOMELESS CENSUS AND SURVEY

CONTINUUM OF CARE

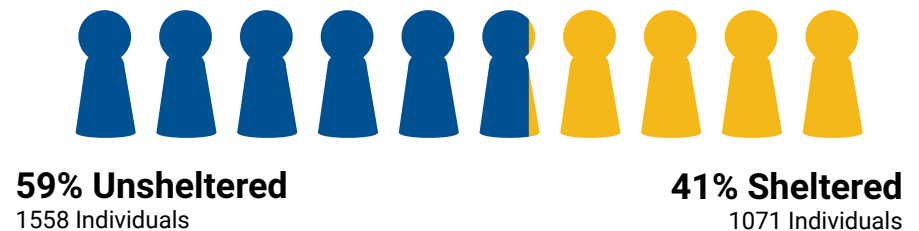
Every two years, during the last week of January, communities across the country conduct comprehensive counts of the local homeless populations in order to measure the prevalence of homelessness in each local Continuum of Care.

The 2019 San Joaquin County Point-in-Time Count was a community-wide effort conducted on January 29, 2019. Data was collected on 2,629 sheltered and unsheltered individuals through surveys, observations, and information reported in the located Homeless Management Information System.

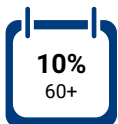
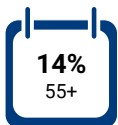
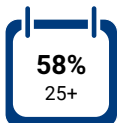
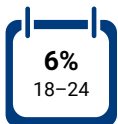
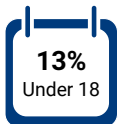
Census Population

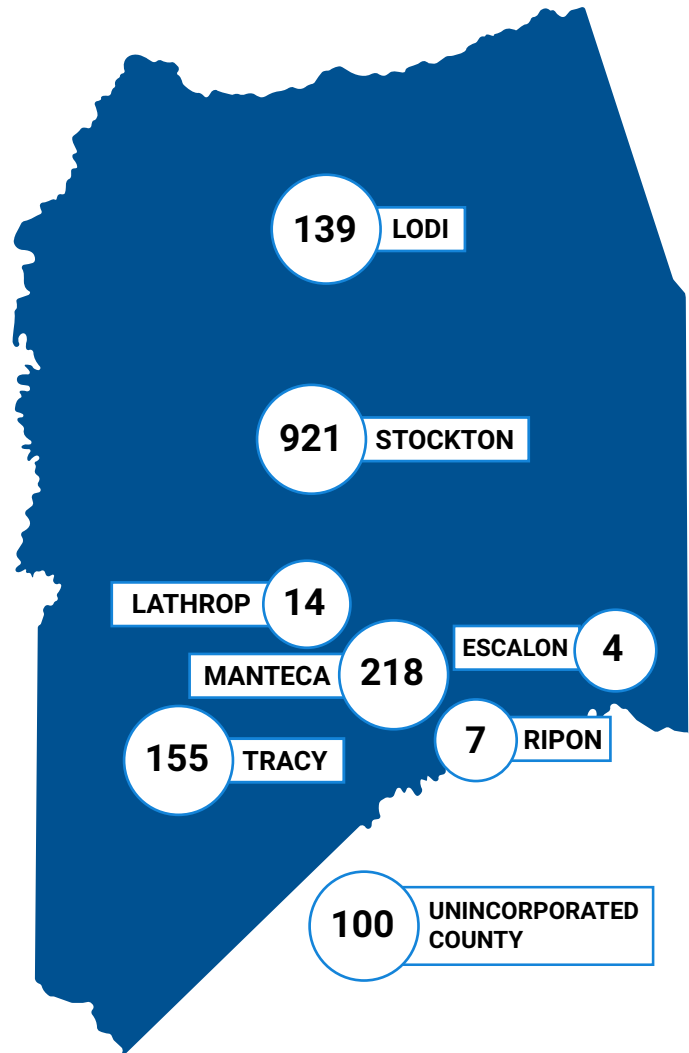


Self Reported Health¹

Current health conditions that may affect the housing stability or employment of those experiencing homelessness.

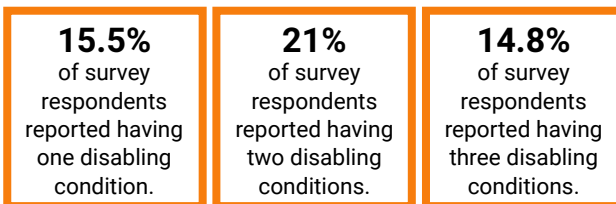


Number of Unsheltered Homeless by City



Disabling Conditions

Respondents reported the number of conditions that limited their ability to maintain work or housing. Many reported multiple conditions.



*Subpopulation Definitions

<p>Chronically Homeless</p> <p>An individual with one or more disabling conditions or a family with a head of household with a disabling condition who:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Has been continuously homeless for 1 year or more and/or; ✓ Has experienced 4 or more episodes of homelessness within the past 3 years. 	<p>Veterans</p> <p>Persons who have served on active duty in the Armed Forces of the United States. This does not include inactive military reserves or the National Guard unless the person was called up to active duty.</p>	<p>Families</p> <p>A household with at least one adult member (persons 18 or older) and at least one child (persons under 18).</p>	<p>Unaccompanied Youth & Transitional Age Youth</p> <p>Youth under the age of 18 and young adults between the ages of 16 and 24 years old (TAY) who are experiencing homelessness and living without a parent or legal guardian.</p>
